**Public Reports**

**UPD - Chief Anjewierden**

- There will be a Veterans Parade in Magna scheduled for Nov. 11 at 11 am. UPD sponsored a K-9 demonstration at West Kearns Elementary for Red Ribbon Week. There will be a Pokemon walking party with law enforcement on Nov. 15.
- Officer W. Dallof will host a security seminar at the Kearns Library. Date not stated. The Kearns Community and Council were thanked again for the Cougar Lane clean-up. Steve Perry states a private entity owns the property and they will help keep the area clean in the future. The Misty Way speed trailer is calming traffic in the area. Also mentioned was the recent article in the newspaper that slants the level of crime in Kearns to be more than other areas.
- Unified Police Department was asked by Al Petersen if a community home in the article was found to be contaminated with drugs. UPD remarked, “No.” The drugs found was marijuana and was a family member that had just moved in to the home.
- Jana Helsten asked about a recent street light that had been broken.
- Kelli Bush thanked UPD for the speed trailer. Chief Anjewierden asked the public to contact UPD if they have any community problems.
- Linguistical International is a new business in Kearns. They moved into the area 2 months ago. They are hiring interpreters for translation. All languages and English is needed.

**KOPFC – Steve Cook**

- Wants support and questions about the new expansion of the Utah Oval and Oquirrh Park. Expansion does create disruption. We will postpone the Fire, Water and Ice event for 2017, having a bigger and better event for 2018.

- The senior center does not currently give flu shots.

- The public was informed in a presentation of what ChamberWest does for the Kearns community.
- There are up to 75 people on the Board of Governors with 2 new trustees coming from the business community.
